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Community Grants

Small Grant Scheme

The small grant scheme can help communities get creative and provide support for up to £200 for a one-off initiative project for the local community. The funding can be used towards one-off expenditures, one-off equipment, providing better services, and reaching more people. Match funding of 50% is required which can be a mix of cash and volunteer time. Application forms can be completed online at www.nwleics.gov.uk/grants

Coalville Special Expenses Community Chest Grant Scheme

This is a grants programme to support and promote a range of community activities, initiatives and events that meet the needs of residents within the following wards: Coalville, Keston, Indrton, Thringstone and Greenhill. Grants can vary for up to £200, and commitment will be given to all applicants that can demonstrate the benefits of their project or engagement for the local community within the ward stated. No match funding is required. Application forms can be completed online at www.nwleics.gov.uk/grants

Green Grants

As part of the Green Footprints initiative, we are offering Green Grants of £200 each for environmentally-focused community projects across the district. These are simple projects that make a big impact and are open to groups and organisations, including parish councils. 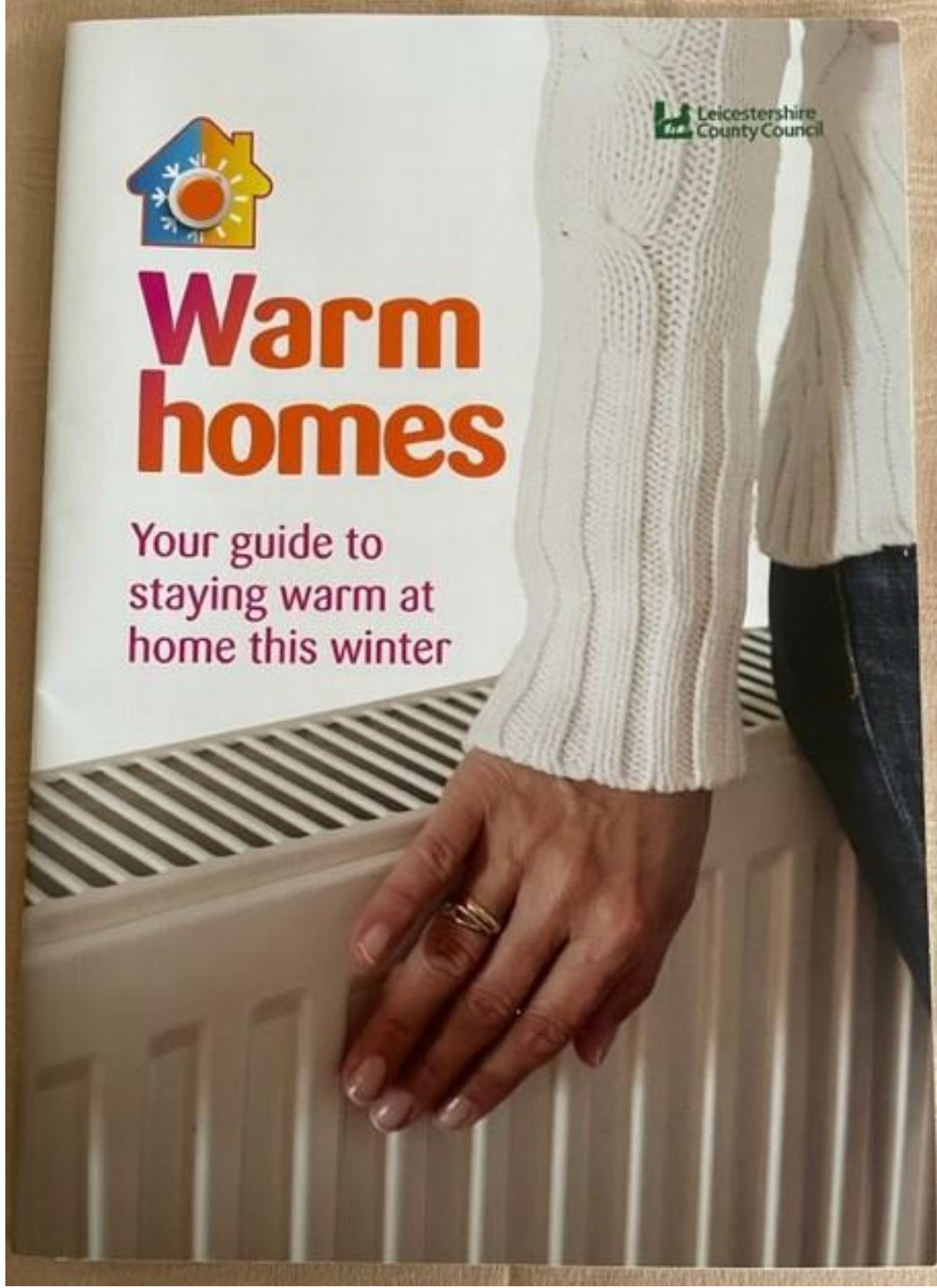

Doorstep Crime and Scams

Doorstep crime and scams across the UK affect the lives of millions of people.

Sales people

Sales people who call at your home may seem friendly and genuine. They may use high pressure sales techniques by telling you scare stories, or offer you a special discount or a 'free gift'. They only want one thing and that is to sell you something so they can make money. You do not have to buy anything and you will probably get a better deal by shopping around and buying from a reputable business.

Casual workmen

Another type of caller you may get is the casual workman who is in the area. Sometimes they will tell you they have spotted a problem with your roof or chimney. Others say that they have some paving slabs or tarmac left over from another job. Often they promise a bargain.

If you suspect a rogue trader calling at your door, dial 101. In an emergency call 999.



Doorstep callers, what should you do?

Trading Standards advise never to buy goods or services from a trader on your doorstep.

Don't answer your door if you are not expecting a caller. If the person needs to contact you urgently, they will put a note through your door or have your contact details and be able to contact you via other means.

BEWARE DOORSTEP CALLERS

- LOCK** KEEP FRONT AND BACK DOOR LOCKED.
- STOP** ARE YOU EXPECTING SOMEONE?
- CHAIN** PUT CHAIN ON BEFORE ANSWERING THE DOOR.
- CHECK** IDENTITY OF CALLER.

My name is **Sonia** and I am the Community Recovery Worker for North West Leicestershire Local Communities
